

VARIETAL INFORMATION for peppers, tomatoes, eggplant from ANTICIPATED varieties; some may not be available until mid-May; some are limited quantity...some may already be sold out! We focus on open-pollinated, **HEIRLOOM** varieties from organic non-gmo seed. All are grown from seed on the farm...certified organic & certified Biodynamic. DETERMINATE/BUSH (short season) TOMATOES

- **Bellstar Dwarf**, early plum variety perfect for short seasons & concentrated harvests. Plants are covered with round fruit measuring 2-2.5" in diameter. Smooth, fleshy interior is great for sauce, processing or fresh eating.
- **Celebrity F1** Medium-large, 7-8 oz., flavorful red slicer ripens early/mid-season. Widely adapted. High resistance to tomato mosaic virus. Vigorous determinate.
- **Crimson Sprinter** Brilliant candy-apple red color. Medium-sized 5 - 7 oz fruits are abundant & ripen nicely on the vine. Notably high lycopene content. Holds well due to its thick skin. Semi-determinate.
- **Djena Lee's Golden HEIRLOOM** This Minnesota **HEIRLOOM** won first prize in the Chicago World's Fair in the 1930's. Prolific clusters of light yellow-orangish 5 oz. fruits.
- **Fireworks HEIRLOOM** 5 -7 oz. red fruits; yields well & early. Open pollinated. One of our best & most consistent early producers. Seed saved from our own farm.
- **Golden Delight – HEIRLOOM** Heavy, early set of deep golden-yellow 5-8 oz. round fruits. Low acid, mild but excellent flavor. Good tomato for people who have trouble with digesting the acid in red tomatoes.
- **Heinz** produces bounties of 3-4 oz paste/roma tomatoes...great for ripening close together. Great sauce flavor.
- **Iron Lady F1** blight resistant, dense juicy flavorful red slicer...produced well for us in 2013 heat & dry.
- **Medford HEIRLOOM Big, round, crack-resistant field tomatoes with good disease resistance.** Perfectly rounded, solid uniform fruits with rich tomato flavor. Plants have good leaf cover & prefer a cage rather than being staked or trellised. Bred by the late Dr. Tex Frazier of Oregon State University.
- **Mountain Princess HEIRLOOM** nice red tomatoes on more compact plants...earlier variety & favorite.
- **Nova F1** determinate paste/plum type – wonderful tomato that keeps producing!
- **Oregon Spring** Produces 4" oval red slicers developed at Oregon State University.
- **Ranger F1** determinate paste, good tomato flavor...prolific!
- **Roma VF HEIRLOOM** Excellent paste open-pollinated tomato. Popular for canning or making sauce, juice or drying. Plum shaped fruit ripen to a bright red with meaty interiors.
- **Rutgers HEIRLOOM** Long window of ripening -- 60-100 days. Determinate. Good for canning, also excellent fresh; large red 8-oz globes. Good yields & flavor, large vines. A fine **HEIRLOOM**.
- **Siletz** one of our quickest to produce...nice red slicer, some on the larger size for fruits, good flavor.
- **Taxi** Great yellow tomato for short season. Grows to about 2 feet tall. Expect heavy yields of mild, non-acid light yellow tomatoes for 3-4 weeks...hint of pink in centers.

INDETERMINATE/VINING/LONG-SEASON TOMATOES

SLICERS & PASTE/ROMAS

- **Amish Paste HEIRLOOM** produces an abundance of thick-fleshed, acorn-shaped fruits weighing 8 oz. Few seeds; excellent sauce tomato.
- **Berkely Tie-Dye Green** Incredibly colorful large-fruited slicing variety! Fruits run 8 -16 oz. Exterior color is green with stripes in red & yellow, but truly tri-color! Creamy green flesh infused with various shades of red & yellow. Each of these colors has a different flavor resulting in a spicy, sweet, tart tomato with good acid all in one fruit. New open-pollinated variety.
- **Black Prince HEIRLOOM** Mahogany brown fruit with unusual brown shoulders becoming orange-red at blossom end. Rich fruity flavor. Smooth, rich, fruity tomato flavor. 3-5 oz., 3" fruits show less cracking.
- **Cosmonaut Volkov HEIRLOOM** Reliable producer, even in colder summers. Deep red, slightly flattened 8 – 10 oz. fruits with sweet rich flavor.

INDETERMINATE/VINING/LONG-SEASON TOMATOES - continued

SLICERS & PASTE/ROMAS

- **David Davison HEIRLOOM** Given to Seed Savers Exchange by member Robert Bell, who indicated the variety is a Tennessee heirloom from David Davidson. Mid-size orange globe tomatoes grow in clusters of up to 7 fruits. Great flavor with hints of citrus. Keeps well.
- **Gilbertie Paste HEIRLOOM** Long, slender shape with characteristically green shoulders & a slight crook in the neck. Narrow fruits are on average 7" long & 10-12 oz. Flesh is very solid, with a beloved rich flavor that makes excellent sauces & soups. Very small seed cavity.
- **Green Zebra HEIRLOOM** True green tomato with green striping. A delicious, tangy salad tomato, shows ripeness as as fruit develops yellow blush, accentuating darker green stripes. Lots of 3-4 oz fruits.
- **Hungarian Heart HEIRLOOM** Brilliant reddish-pink oxheart type fruits are enormous—frequently exceeding 1#. firm & meaty like all oxheart types—great for paste, canning or fresh use. Rich tasting, solid flesh across each hefty slice! Originated outside of Budapest, Hungary around 1900. Basically a beefsteak but an oxheart too!
- **Japanese Trifele Black** Pear-shaped fruit has green-streaked shoulders, deepening to a burnished mahogany & a darkened, nearly black base. Meaty interior has similar shades & complex flavor **NOT PLANTED for 2018**
- **Jersey Devil** Prolific producer of larger, paste/roma type tomatoes. Not very seedy, meaty & good flavor.
- **Kellogg Breakfast HEIRLOOM** == not planted for 2018 == next year!
- **Jaune Flamme HEIRLOOM** Excellent smaller yellow tomato, with some fruity zippy flavors. Very productive. Think Sungold cherry all grown up!
- **Moonglow** Nice producer of orange fruits, does well in Nebraska climate & has great flavor!
- **Moskovich Red HEIRLOOM** Early producing & grows fast, great slicer...so pretty & nice red tomato balance. No cracking, slightly flattened globes. Just all around lovely.
- **Nebraska Wedding HEIRLOOM** Listed in the 1983 Seed Savers Exchange Yearbook by Dorothy Beiswenger of Crookston, MN. Reliable producer of stunning 4" round fruits with glowing orange skin.
- **Nepal HEIRLOOM** Soft, meaty red fruits. Excellent tomato flavor with medium acidity. Yields well; 10 oz fruits...one of our field favorites.
- **Opalka Paste HEIRLOOM** It's said the seed originated in Poland circa 1900. Beautiful set of 3 - 6" red paste tomatoes on vigorous wispy vines. Excellent flavor & few seeds make this a perfect processing tomato. Fruits hold well on the vine.
- **Orange Blossom F1** Does well in Nebraska, thicker skin, lower acid. All around good tomato.
- **Peron HEIRLOOM** great red slicer, does well every year for us in the field. Fruits are wonderful for fresh eating or canning. Semi-determinate...we use as a indeterminate planting. Also called Peron Sprayless.
- **Persimmon HEIRLOOM** Dates back to the mid-1800s & is right at home in short-season gardens. Light orange & good flavor. Bear big beefsteak-size fruit with few blemishes...beefsteak size but more slicer with firm skin & structure.
- **Pink Boar** Nice size 4 oz gem is pinkish-wine colored with metallic green stripes...great for fresh eating!
- **Redfield Beauty HEIRLOOM** Historic variety introduced circa 1889 by H.G. Hastings & Co. of Interlachen, Florida. Flattened pink 3" fruits with excellent full flavor. Vigorous, very productive plants.
- **Ruth's Perfect HEIRLOOM** Mid-season favorite red slicer, 7 oz. fruits on sturdy plants. From Ruth Zinniker, Biodynamic farmer.
- **San Marzano HEIRLOOM** Superior paste with high solid content, heavy yields, excellent for canning & sauce. 5-6 oz. fruits, about 3" long.
- **San Marzano Gigante** More of the San Marzano flavor in a bigger, meatier size! So good!
- **Speckled Roman** Wonderful flavor & deep red meaty paste tomato...great for sauce!
- **Tang** Dark orange slicer that does well in dry conditions...high in beta carotene & has good production.
- **Tiren F1 Paste** San Marzano type; Developed in Italy, Tiren produces meaty, 5-6 oz. fruits with the classic San Marzano appearance. Great flavor for sauce. High resistance to fusarium wilt, tomato mosaic virus.
- **Sunkisted F1** nice producer of high quality fruits...they just keep going! Very limited for 2018.

- **Super Lakota HEIRLOOM** (like Super Sioux) Large, red, juicy, great slicer! Thick walled, 6 – 8 oz fruits. Old fashioned flavor...one of our farm favorites! Developed at Nebraska Experiment station in 1944.
- **Sweet 'n' Bright (Hellfrucht) HEIRLOOM** A small salad tomato, classic tomato flavor with great disease resistance for early & mid-season harvest with cascades of bright red glossy 2-3 oz. round fruit.
- **Valencia** Sunny orange fruits; thick-walls, meaty interiors & few seeds. Mid-season tomato with good texture.
- **Wapsinicon Peach HEIRLOOM** Slightly fuzzy pale-yellow skin & fruity, balanced flavor. Firm fruits have a blush tint when ripe & hold well on & off the vine. Named by Dennis Schlicht for the Wapsinicon River in Iowa.

BEEFSTEAK TOMATOES – indeterminate/long-season/vining varieties

- **Black Krim HEIRLOOM** Originally from the Isle of Krim on the Black Sea. Deep rich black-red color; yields 3 – 4" flattened beefsteak fruits with deep green shoulders. Intense, slightly salty taste; for fresh eating or cooking.
- **Brandywine HEIRLOOM** Big & beautiful! This classic variety was one of the first to bring recognition to the **HEIRLOOM** label. Known for its perfect balance of sugars & flavor. Dark pinkish-red flesh is smooth & juicy, so make sure to have a napkin handy! Fruits are very large, weighing 1 lb or more. Pick just before ripe to avoid cracking. Potato-leaf variety.
- **Cherokee Purple HEIRLOOM** Famously rich flavor & texture make this a colorful favorite. Medium-large, flattened globe, 12 oz fruit. Color is dusky pink with mahogany & dark shoulders. Multilocular interior ranges from *purple* to brown to green. Relatively short vines.
- **Crnkovic Red HEIRLOOM** Brought to the US by Yasha Crnkovic. Good yields of pink beefsteak fruits, weighing up to 1# each. Fruits have near perfect shoulders that almost never crack. Great full tomato flavor.
- **Copia** orange/yellow & pink beefsteak with deep flavor & large fruits...a cross with Green Zebra & Marvel Stripe varieties. Big in size & flavor!
- **German Johnson HEIRLOOM** Vigorous, higher-yielding Brandywine type with excellent flavor. Sets deep pink excellent fruits with lots of deep, acidic tomato flavor & a rich texture. A farm favorite!
- **German Pink HEIRLOOM** One of the tomatoes that originally ignited the **HEIRLOOM** movement in America, this variety originated in Bavaria. It made its US debut in 1883, brought here by Michael Ott, a great-grandfather of Seed Savers Exchange co-founder Diane Ott Whealy. A potato-leaf variety (with rugosa leaves) gives high yields of 1-2 lb, nearly seedless fruit. Beautiful pink fruits are versatile: canning, freezing, sauce, fresh eating, juicing.
- **Hillbilly Potato Leaf HEIRLOOM** Gorgeous bicolor beefsteak tomato, great for slicing. Beautiful yellow 1 pound fruits are streaked with red on the blossom end. Sweet & juicy. Heavy producer.
- **Kanner Hoell HEIRLOOM** Reverend C. Frank Morrow of Minnesota. In his donation letter, Reverend Morrow states that the variety originated in Germany & has been in his family since 1916. Red beefsteak fruit 4-5" in diameter, 1½ lbs. Double fruit common. Good flavor, low acid, moderately sweet.
- **Mortgage Lifter HEIRLOOM** 1-lb pink fruits have a delicious, rich, sweet taste. This variety has become very popular in recent years & was developed by M.C. Byles of Logan, West Virginia. After crossing varieties for 6 years & selecting the best, he introduced this beauty that he named Mortgage Lifter in the 1940s, after he sold plants for \$1 each & paid off the \$6000 mortgage on his house
- **Purple Calabash HEIRLOOM** One of the most interesting looking & complex tasting tomatoes you can grow. Cinderella pumpkin-shaped tomatoes are about 3"x 1 ½' tall & deeply ribbed. Light green-purple at the shoulders with dark purple at base & dark purple interior. Very complex deep tomato flavors.
- **Striped German** great yellow & pink beefsteak...nice flavor! More yellow than pink/red, the marbled interior looks beautiful sliced. Complex, fruity flavor & smooth texture. Medium-tall vines bear 12+ oz. fruit.
- **Yellow Brandywine HEIRLOOM** Similar flavor, appearance and plant habit to the famous Brandywine, with large gold fruits. Golden flesh is smooth, juicy & delectable with relatively low acids. Pick just before ripe to avoid cracking. Potato-leaf foliage.

CHERRY TOMATOES

- **Atomic Grape** larger cherry fruits, deep purple with green striping. Nice flavor & prolific!
- **Bing Cherry** Exceptional flavor is sweet with a rich tomato flavor, well-balanced acid & thin skin. Plants are loaded with clusters of medium sized, 1" red cherry tomatoes. Indeterminate
- **Black Cherry** Vigorous regular leaf plants covered in clusters of 1" round cherry tomatoes. Dusky purple-black fruits bursting with rich flavor—sweet & complex. Indeterminate
- **Bumblebee varieties: Pink, Purple & Sunrise** – all variations of striped nice-size cherry tomatoes. Great flavor, no cracking & a delight to pick & eat!
- **Chadwick Cherry HEIRLOOM** Nice size prolific cherry tomato named after Alan Chadwick, long time seed saver.
- **Esterina** similar to Sungold, maybe better with less cracking
- **Gold Nugget** small gold & prolific with lovely flavor – low acid.
- **Igleheart Yellow** similar to Sungold...open pollinated, small, prolific.
- **Indigo Rose** Deep red-purple color with deep flavor. Larger size cherry.
- **Lemon Drop HEIRLOOM** Seed originally from Florida Seed Savers Exchange member J. T. Sessions, who found this growing on Snow White Cherry plants. Heavy sets of ½-¾" yellow-green cherry tomatoes. Refreshing tart-sweet flavor.
- **Matt's Wild HEIRLOOM** Small fruits on prolific huge vines!
- **Peacevine** heavy yields of many fruited clusters. Red fruit; excellent flavor. An occasional orange fruit will appear. Named for its high content of gamma amino butyric acid, a calming body sedative.
- **Red Pear HEIRLOOM** red, pear shaped...good tomato flavor & very prolific!
- **Snow White Cherry** just like it says!
- **Sungold F1** Wonderful fruity flavor; yellow-orange, very sweet. Yields heavy, best for home garden & fresh eating!
- **Sweetie** Sweet & red & prolific! Disease resistant with great tomato flavor!
- **Yellow Pear HEIRLOOM** Solid producer of yellow, mild-tomato flavored fruits...yellow & pear shaped.
- **Washington Cherry** nice clustering red cherry tomato with good tomato flavor & hints of sweetness.

EGGPLANT

- **Black Beauty** Early maturing northern variety, classic shaped-oblong fruits. Most plants set 3 – 4 fruits each. **SIMILAR:** Diamond, Florida High Bush, Nubia, Michal & others possible.
- **Fairytale F1** Bush type with classic deep purple fruits; great for containers or raised bed or in an open garden.
- **Listada di Gandia** One of the most beautiful eggplants. A specialty purple striped Italian eggplant with an oval egg shape. Petite fruits sit nicely in the palm of your hand. Plants are very productive & fruits are tender & delicious, averaging 6-8" long. Skin is thinner than most Italian types. **SIMILAR:** Violetta.
- **Little Finger** Slender 4 - 6 in. fruit with a glossy black skin. Harvest when fruit is young & cook quickly for delicate flavor. The benefits of a traditional eggplants combined with the Oriental shape oblate fruits. LIMITED.
- **Louisiana Long Green** Very prolific fruit set with mild eggplant flavor...long, green skinned fruits.
- **Nadia F1** Narrower classic deep color fruits; solid producer.
- **Patio Baby F1** bush type with smaller deep purple fruits; great for patio, smaller gardens & containers.
- **Ping Tung** Asian, long purple variety. Consistent producer of 8" narrow fruits.
- **Rosa Bianca** nice size deep pink/light purple fruits.
- **Snowy Eggplant** Somewhat smaller version of white-skinned eggplant. Think traditional eggplant with mild flavor & white skin.
- **Violetta di Lunga** pretty striped fruits, narrower in shape than Black Beauty.

PEPPERS - HOT: SWEETS: BELLS

BELL PEPPERS

- **Abay Gold** limited quantity; wonderful yellow pepper
- **California Wonder** Prolific plants produce large thick-walled fruits. Deep green color will turn red when left to mature.
- **Canary Bell** yellow bell with good, but not overpowering, flavor.
- **Golden California Wonder** Light yellow bell
- **Iko Iko** Purple & yellow peppers ripening to tangerine & red.
- **Jupiter** Green bell, nice large size. Good flavor & lovely to pick in the field & garden.
- **King Crimson** Early pepper are medium-sized & blocky.
- **King of the North** Sturdy plants, green-to-red bell. One of our farm favorites.
- **Madonna** solid gold/deep yellow pepper producing good size, medium-walled fruits.
- **Napoleon** nice size deep green fruits
- **Olympus** similar to Jupiter...thick walled, larger fruits.
- **Orange Bell** nice producer of lovely fruits
- **Purple Beauty** nice producer of medium purple fruits
- **Purple Star** Thick-walled peppers that are fully purple when ripe. Nice flavor turning deep purple-red.
- **Ruby King** earlier fruit set turning to red peppers with time.
- **Sweet Chocolate** a smaller bell with a slightly sweet, complex flavor. Harvest when chocolatey brown.

BELL PEPPERS CONTINUED:

- **Wisconsin Lakes** Nice looking pepper...will turn red over time on the plant. Earlier fruit set.
- **Yankee Bell** Open pollinated. Blocky 3-4 lobed fruits are medium sized & a bit smaller than some hybrids. Good quality & uniformity.

SWEET & SPECIALTY PEPPERS

- **Goddess Banana HEIRLOOM** An extremely popular pepper. Large, pointed fruits measure 6-7" & 1½". The mild yellow peppers will turn brilliant red if left on the plant. A favorite for pickling or fresh eating.
- **Carmen F1** A beautiful pepper of the Italian "bull's horn" (corno di toro) type with great flavor. Carmen has a lovely, sweet taste for salads & roasting, especially when partially or fully red-ripe. Tapered fruits avg. 6" long x 2 ½" wide, 5 oz. & ripen from green to deep carmine red.
- **Corno di Toro HEIRLOOM** Italian variety known for the horn shape. Sweet flavor of red mature fruits.
- **Cornito Gaillo** green-to-yellow fruits with medium-long oblate shape.
- **Feher Ozon HEIRLOOM** Stout juicy sweet peppers start white, ripening to yellow, orange then red. Great sub early on for green peppers. High yields. Smaller fruits. Traditionally dried for paprika. Can have a slight hint of warmth sometimes. We love this pepper!
- **Lipstick** Pointed thick-walled 4" fruit. Use fresh or roasted. Nice flavor...we think sweeter than Carmen, just smaller in size.
- **Sheepnose Pimento HEIRLOOM** Ohio heirloom from the family of SSE member Nick Rini dating back to at least 1940. Tomato-type peppers are exceedingly flavorful with sweet juicy flesh. Very meaty, good for canning.
- **Shishito** Small mild Japanese pepper for roasting, pan-frying, grilling. Harvest when green. Very limited.
- **Stocky Red Roaster** Italian frying pepper. Sweet attractive thick walled 4-6" long & 2" wide.

HOT PEPPERS

- **Alma paprika** a smaller pale yellow fruit with just a hint of warmth...very nice.
- **Anaheim** Long mildly hot peppers traditionally roasted green, used for chiles rellenos or for drying & stringing in dried red ristras.
- **Ancho** Nice pepper for roasting, salsas & stuffing! Bell peppers shape.
- **Aurora** similar to Bolivian Rainbow...grows into a lovely bush with intense multi-colored fruits.

- **Black Hungarian** Highly ornamental & useful in the kitchen. Green foliage is highlighted by purple veins & beautiful purple flowers. 3 - 4" fruits similar in shape to Jalapenos, but black ripening to red. Medium-hot with good flavor.
- **Bolivian Rainbow Rainbow** colored fruits, about 1 in. in size. Very hot! Some are deep yellow, deep purple, orange & red as they mature.
- **Bulgarian Carrot** fruity, orange, prolific, HOT!
- **Beaver Dam – not planted for 2018**
- **Cayenne Joe's Long & also Ring of Fire** Classic cayenne shape & heat. 2-3 ft. plant produces an abundance of hot, straight, tapered, 4" fruits. Excellent quality. Good dried or fresh. Red when ripe.
- **Carolina Reaper** THE HOTTEST PEPPER! (or is there another one...someone's trying to up the heat game out there!?) REALLY – HANDLE FRUITS WITH & EATING WITH CARE!
- **Fatalii** darn hot!
- **Fish HEIRLOOM** green & white striped smaller oblong fruits on plants that have variegated leaves. Nice heat.
- **Ghost Pepper/Jhot Bolokia: SUPER HOT!**
- **Habanero, Magnum** Super hot! Avg. 2" x 1 1/4", wrinkled fruits ripen from dark green to light orange. May be used fresh or dried. Key ingredient in Jamaican "jerk" sauces. Prolific yields in most summers.
- **Habanero, Peach**
- **Hot Claw** Good heat, grows upright on the plant in clusters...picked yellow, orange or red.
- **Hungarian Hot Wax** a yellow-green long pepper with mild-medium heat...great for eggs, salsa & anything in between!
- **Jalapeno, Early** Hot Jalapeno with early ripening & hot bite. Blunt peppers can be eaten dark green or wait until red. (*also have El Jefe Jalapeno*)
- **Jalapeno, El Jefe** (also Jalafuego & Craig's Grande, Jedi, Trifuno)
- **Korean Dark Green (Gochugaru)** THE go-to hot pepper for Kimchi. High yields of small peppers; harvest red.
- **Numex Sauve** low heat habanero
- **Pichan** small fiery hot pepper...can be brought in potted up & grown as a small tree. Seed handed down from Mexico stock.
- **Serrano, Hot Rod**
- **Trinidad Scorpion – LIMITED** – second or third hottest pepper there is. WATCH OUT! Limited
